Yet I believe there is also a desire for a better future than what we experienced in the past. The prophet Ezekiel writes,

The metaphor of a cold heart, a heart of stone, and a hardened heart are engrained in our consciousness as synonymous with being uncaring, unfeeling, and possessing a total lack of empathy for others.

For instance, the scriptures describe Pharoah as "hardening his heart" against the Israelites. Perhaps we are longing for more love, and greater compassion as we begin this new year.
